Neighbourhood Watch Report 29th February to 28th March 2008

Assault

17 th March	Two males were riding their cycles along Woodhouse Road, when a passenger in a passing car threw objects at them. No injuries caused. The details provided about the car have not produced any suspects.

Burglary dwelling

12 th March	Newly built premises on High Street broken into. Nothing stolen. There are no outstanding enquiries.
22 nd March	DISTRACTION BURGLARY – during the early afternoon, two males claiming to be from the water board deceived the elderly occupant into allowing them in. While one distracted the occupant, the other stole money.
23 rd March	A house off Woodhouse Road was targeted while the occupants were on holiday. It is not believed anything was stolen as the alarm was triggered. Two males have been arrested in relation to this. Enquiries continue.
26 th March	A house on Barrow Road was targeted during the day, by forcing a rear, ground floor window. It is not clear if anything has been stolen yet, but a male has been arrested for this and he is on bail pending further enquiries.
26 th March	A house in the area of Woodhouse Road was targeted and property was stolen. The names of two suspects are known and these males are currently wanted by Police.

Burglary other than dwelling

4 th March	Quorn Football club changing rooms was targeted and items were stolen. There are no outstanding enquiries.
5 th March	Quorn Football club changing rooms again. There are no outstanding enquiries.
8 th March	A garage on Loughborough Road was targeted and a chainsaw was stolen. There are no outstanding enquiries.
20 th March	Barrow Town Football club (The Quorn border extends just beyond this area): money stolen from behind the bar

Damage

4 th March	Damage caused to the doors at Bradley's, by a male that was causing staff problems. The male is known and enquiries continue.
14 th March	A wing mirror was kicked off a car on Station Road, during the overnight period. There are no outstanding enquiries.

Theft

4 th March	Over a 3 day period, a bird scarcer was stolen from a field off Woodhouse Rd. There are no outstanding enquiries.
16 th March	Ornamental chimney pots were stolen from a garden in Castledine Street during the early hours. There are no further enquiries.
19 th March	A pedal cycle was stolen from a garden in Castledine Street during the afternoon. There are no outstanding enquiries.
19 th March	A pedal cycle was stolen from outside Quorn football club during the evening. There are no outstanding enquiries.
20 th March	A laptop was stolen from a driveway in Stirling Close, while the owner was unloading the car.
19 th March	A roof rack was stolen from a car parked on a drive in the Station Road area. Enquiries continue.
