Assault

"Glen Parva does not sponsor or support ex. offenders selling door to door.

It does not form part of a resettlement programme nor do we have any links with companies that set these sort of things up." So to conclude, if you open your door and hear the statement 'I am an ex-offender on a resettlement programme from Glen Parva - they're not!

The week commencing 16th June 2008 has been designated as National Neighbourhood Watch Week. One theme will look at the ways local communities can improve their environment and to tackle anti-social behaviour.

Appeal to trace victims of a fraud in the Midlands

Detectives from Leicestershire Constabulary are appealing for the victims of a fraud committed in the Midlands to contact them.

Following a routine stop check of a vehicle on the M1 motorway on Saturday April 26, electrical items and a large quantity of cash was discovered in the vehicle.

A 23-year-old man was arrested and has since been charged with offences under the Trademark Act 1994. He appeared at Hinckley Magistrates' Court on Monday April 28 and was remanded back into police custody. Camcorders have been sold to members of the public from a vehicle at work premises, shopping centres outside retail premises across the Midlands. The camcorders are not originals and are cheaper models which have the Sony and JVC labels and serial numbers.

It is also believed that faulty flat screen or plasma screen televisions have also been sold to members of the public, the televisions are wrapped in cling film or plastic wrapping.

A number of Sony and JVC labels and serial numbers have also been recovered from the vehicle.

Detective Constable Pete Watson of Hinckley local policing unit is investigating the incidents, he said: "We know that a number of people may have purchased these items in good faith but may have since realised that the goods are not originals or in working order if you were one of those people then we urge you to contact us immediately.

"We do not believe that the items are stolen and appeal to any victims to come forward without fear. Any information we receive will be treated in the strictest confidence."
