Woodhouse Rd	3rd – 4th Sept.	Front door of premises forced open whilst occupants away Property taken. Forensic examination has been completed of the scene and a DNA profile obtained. This has resulted in the arrest of a crime suspect who is now on Police Bail pending further forensic examinations.

Theft

High St.	5 th Sept.	Whilst aggrieved participating in Sports activity unknown person has taken property from a changing room.
High St.	10th Sept.	Young male has his pedal cycle stolen whilst at educational premises. No suspects or witnesses.
High St.	12 th Sept.	Young male is the victim of a Robbery where the suspect had a knife and threatened violence and took victims iPod. Suspect detained and arrested for this offence at the time. The iPod was recovered. The suspect has been charged with this offence.
Station Rd.	13th Sept.	Vehicle left locked and secure. Entry gained by forcing driver's door and stereo stolen. No suspect or witnesses.
Church Lane.	15th Sept.	The aggrieved left their pedal cycle insecure whilst attended a function. Upon return found that the pedal cycle had been stolen
A6 Quorn	19th Sept.	Male detained following Police attending RTC. Established male had taken vehicle without the owners consent. Charged with this offence.
High Street.	21st Sept.	Theft of School bag. At this stage no suspects or witnesses.
Castledine Ave.	22nd Sept.	Vehicle left locked and secure. Aggrieved leaves vehicle for short period of time but returns when hears alarm and discovers damage caused to car window and sat nav taken. Ongoing enquires re possible cctv
High St	25th Sept.	Theft of handbag. Suspect has been detained and interviewed about this matter admitted offence and reported.

High St.	3rd Sept.	Damaged caused to property by graffiti. Captured on cctv but due to poor quality no evidential value.
Caves Field.	3 rd – 4 th Sept.	Damage caused to cricket equipment and pavilion. No suspects or witnesses.
Leicester Rd.	10 th – 11 th Sept.	Damage caused to Bus Shelter. No witnesses or suspects.
Stafford Orchard Park.	18 th – 19 th Sept.	Damage caused to park bench by sawing a section out of the bench. No witnesses or suspects.
Station Rd.	20 th Sept.	Damage has been caused to body work of a motor vehicle parked in the car park. Enquiries are ongoing at this stage.

25 Years of Neighbourhood Watch

This year marks the 25th anniversary of Neighbourhood Watch in the UK, come along and celebrate with us. The first Neighbourhood Watch scheme was set up in the village of Mollington, Cheshire in 1982 and from those small beginnings, Watch schemes quickly spread throughout the country. In 2007 there are now 8,432,000 homes registered as members of Neighbourhood Watch in England and Wales, making it the largest voluntary community movement in thru UK.

To celebrate this Silver Anniversary in the UK Leicestershire and Rutland County NHW Association is participating with Leicestershire Constabulary and the Leicestershire Villages website team in holding two events for the benefit of members, during Neighbourhood Watch Week commencing 15th October. This week has been designated by the Home Office as "Not in my Neighbourhood Week".

The first Neighbourhood Watch Communication Event will be held on Saturday 13th October at Police Force Headquarters in Enderby from 10.30am – 1.30pm. Among the guest speakers will be the Chief Constable Matt Baggot and Colleen Atkins, one of the founder members of the national NHW movement and its first Chair. During the morning there will be a series of talks from the Voice Connect (VC) Relay Community Messaging team, Leicestershire Villages website team and the Police on how we can improve the communication we have with our members and local officers. There will also be opportunities to ask questions and seek advice on running a NHW scheme in your area.

The second Neighbourhood Watch Communication Event will be held at Quorn Country Hotel on Friday 19th October at 7pm. The guest speakers will be Supt Steve Boulton, Colleen Atkins and the VC Relay team and the Leicestershire Villages website team. Because of the reduced time there will be a smaller allocation of time to ask general questions.

The Leicestershire Villages team hopes to encourage members to use the free website to communicate with their members be it in a few homes, in a street or a whole village. Free training can be arranged for anyone wishing to use this valuable service to enhance Neighbourhood Watch in the local community.
